Preface

The AIMS Report, prepared by the Office of the Associate Dean for Administration, is provided for faculty, staff and students of the College of Education and Health Professions to facilitate the management of the College. This report is based on a number of data sources from several offices of the University and the College, and was prepared with the assumption that readers are familiar with the variety of acronyms used on the campus to identify programs and departments.

The report is organized around four areas: faculty and staff resources, student resources, fiscal resources, productivity data and workload analysis. These sections enable the reader to gain an understanding of these areas and to examine our resource allocations as well as student enrollment and degree completion data.

During 2002-2003, the College was engaged in a number of academic programs across six departments based in six buildings on the Fayetteville campus. In addition, degree programs were offered at off-campus centers in locations around the state, through cooperative efforts with the University Division of Continuing Education.

The information in this report reflects a diversity of assignments within the College in our teaching, research and service programs. Several of these programs are based in the Dean's Office and the report reflects faculty and staff assignments to initiatives such as the Arkansas Leadership Academy and Great Expectations of Arkansas.
