

Additional Licensure Plan
Program of Study

School Counseling
Grades P-8, 7-12 and P-12
Masters Degree Required

In addition, to add the school counseling endorsement, the candidate must have either an initial three-year teaching license or the standard Arkansas teaching license and show proof of a minimum of two years teaching experience in a classroom in a standard teaching area prior to the endorsement being added. A license in School Counseling cannot be issued as an initial licensing area and cannot be added by testing only.

University of Arkansas

An Endorsement in School Counseling can be added to a standard teaching area in grades P-4, 4-8 or 7-12. It cannot be added to a license in the non-instructional teaching areas, Adult Education, School Psychology Specialist or Library Media Science. Check with the State of Arkansas Department of Education Professional Licensure Division for more details.

All UA course requirements are subject to change.

Applicants must meet current state requirements at time of application.

A student completing an Additional Licensure Plan (ALP) from the University of Arkansas must meet the following conditions.

- ALP students can transfer six credit hours found on the transfer equivalency guide.
- ALP's that require less than 12 credit hours will be excluded from this policy.
- If an ALP student requests transfer of more than six credits, program faculty approval is required.
- Transfer courses will be accepted for undergraduate courses with a grade of C or above and graduate courses with a grade of B or above.
- **No grade below a C** will be accepted for undergraduate ALP courses taken at the University of Arkansas.
- No grade below a B will be accepted for graduate ALP courses taken at the University of Arkansas.
