Getting Started

Razorback Card Office

Visit the Razorback Card Office to get your official university ID card. This card is used for identification, security access, enrollment verification, meal plan access, and Razorbuck\$ to purchase goods and services.

Key Office

Visit the Key Office (located inside Facilities Management) to get your university keys. Your supervisor will prepare the appropriate paperwork for you to receive your keys. Please be sure to have your University of Arkansas ID card with you before going to the Key Office.

Payroll Services

The payroll services page has information about managing benefits, reading your pay slip, calculating IRS withholding, and updating your direct deposit instructions. This page also includes information about when payroll will run and the date you can expect to receive your paycheck.

Parking Maps & Permits

Once hired, staff are immediately eligible to purchase a parking permit. Permits for yellow faculty/staff lots do not require approval and can be purchased online through the parking account <u>portal</u>. Please be sure to follow all <u>parking regulations</u> and only park in lots covered by your permit. Check the <u>parking map</u> to verify you are legally parked.

Official University Portrait

Be sure to <u>schedule an appointment</u> with the photography studio (<u>photo@uark.edu</u>) located in Davis Hall for an official U of A employee portrait. You can also update your profile through the university's <u>Campus Web Data</u> platform.

Emergency Communications

Be sure you're receiving the university's emergency communications.

- RazALERT (pronounced raise-alert) is the primary emergency and inclement weather notification system for students, faculty, and staff at the University of Arkansas. These messages are sent automatically to all campus landlines and email addresses, and to personal cell phones when that information has been provided to the university in Workday. In order to receive these alerts, you **must** list your cell phone number in Workday as your 'mobile' number.
- WxALERT notifications are the most common messages sent through the RazALERT system. These are sent when snow, ice, or heavy rain forces the university to cancel/postpone classes and/or close/delay business operations.

Please note that there is no need to sign up to receive RazALERT or WxALERT notifications. If you aren't receiving these notifications, please check to make sure your cell phone is listed correctly in Workday. Human Resources and Benefits

Benefits Elections

As part of the onboarding process, you will be prompted to make your benefits elections (including medical, dental, and vision coverage) as well as add dependents and designate beneficiaries. Please keep in mind that if you decline coverage when you are hired, you will not be eligible to make new benefits elections until the window opens at the end of the calendar year without a qualifying life event.

Employee Assistance Program

The university contracts with the Employee Assistance Program to provide confidential personal, professional, and family counseling to benefits-eligible employees and their immediate family at no cost. EAP assists to identify and resolve marital, family, financial, health, substance abuse, legal, and emotional concerns that may negatively impact employee job performance.

Discounted Tuition

Employees at the University of Arkansas Fayetteville are eligible for a significant tuition discount! Employees hired after May 1, 2017, or who begin taking classes or resume taking classes after May 1, 2017, will receive a 90% reduction in tuition at the Fayetteville campus but will be limited to no more than 132 discounted credit hours for undergraduate classes and no more than 72 discounted credit hours for graduate classes. Employees in this category can receive a 50% discount for undergraduate courses only taken at any other University of Arkansas campus, up to 132 credit hours. Learn more <u>here</u>.

Staff Mentorship Program

COEHP's staff mentorship program was established as part of the WE CARE strategic plan in order to improve the staff onboarding process and provide opportunities for professional development. Specifically, the mentorship program exists to connect incoming staff members with the college community, foster ongoing discussion regarding job responsibilities and college/university processes, provide an encouraging sounding board, and improve retention.

All new staff are automatically part of the mentorship program as mentees, whereas seasoned employees from across the college are identified by Staff Council to be potential mentors. Mentors will be provided with guidance about the program prior to the initial meeting. Once potential mentors are identified and have agreed to participate in the program, the Chief of Staff in their ex-officio role on the council will work to pair mentors with mentees who share similar job responsibilities. Mentors and mentees may be from within the same unit or from another unit across the college. The program will not exceed one year for each mentee, and the experience will be tapered: monthly meetings for the first four months, followed by meetings every six weeks for the second four months, culminating in bi-monthly meetings for the last four months. Mentors will be allotted a budget of \$70 for meetings over coffee or lunch.

WE CARE

WE CARE stands for Wellness and Education Commitment to Arkansas Excellence. Dean Kate Mamiseishvili launched the five-year WE CARE Strategic Plan in August 2023. It will guide the college's work in producing impactful research that improves people's lives, increasing transformative learning opportunities for students, and engaging in meaningful partnerships across the state. The strategic plan also calls for the college to embrace a culture of caring that empowers people to thrive in all aspects of life.

Campus Information and Resources

Faulkner Performing Arts Center

Faulkner Performing Arts Center is a community-centered art venue which hosts a variety of renowned performers, culturally relevant events, and music department concerts. U of A faculty and staff are eligible to receive a discount on tickets (see the <u>box office website</u> for details).

<u>UREC</u>

The Department of University Recreation (UREC) serves the university community by providing a diverse selection of recreational opportunities and facilities. All full-time U of A staff are eligible to purchase a <u>UREC membership</u> for themselves and their family.

Pat Walker Health Center

Razorbuck\$

Razorbuck\$ is a debit system that students, faculty, and staff can use to add money to their university ID card. Razorbuck\$ is accepted at most places on campus and can be used for food purchases, haircuts, textbooks, printing, copying, paying parking tickets, and paying fees at Pat Walker Health Center. There are many <u>merchants</u> on and <u>off campus</u> to maximize your <u>Razorbuck\$</u> experience.

Windgate Studio + Design Center

The Windgate Studio and Design Center was completed in 2022 and is a state-of-the-art facility located at the corner of <u>Martin Luther King Boulevard and Hill Avenue</u> in South Fayetteville. The center was designed with both the U of A and northwest Arkansas communities in mind and includes a coffee shop, art exhibitions, events with visiting artists and designers, and a courtyard and amphitheater.

U of A Staff Senate

Staff Senate recognizes and awards Employee of the Quarter and Employee of the Year Awards. <u>Staff Senate</u> <u>Scholarships</u> (including the Barbara G. Taylor Staff Senate Scholarship, the Rick A. Haley Memorial Scholarship, and the Susan Imes Yell Scholarship) are available to degree-seeking University of Arkansas staff members. These scholarships are offered for the fall and/or spring semesters with up to \$250.00 awarded per semester. The number of scholarships and amount awarded per recipient is determined by Staff Senate and dependent on funds available.

Employee and Colleague Resource Groups

University of Arkansas Employee and Colleague Resource Groups (ECRGs) are voluntary, employee-led communities that support a positive and collaborative work environment aligned with our organizational mission and values. These groups bring together employees who share common characteristics, experiences, or interests to provide support, enhance career development, and contribute to personal and professional growth.

Campus Safety App

SafeZone app is a free mobile application for all university faculty, staff and students. With the push of a button, you can call for medical, non-emergency, and emergency assistance. The app connects you directly to the University of Arkansas Police Department (UAPD) when there is an emergency on campus, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Once you activate the app on your phone and request help, your location will be shown on a map for police officers to provide assistance.

Jane B. Gearhart Full Circle Food Pantry

The Jane B. Gearhart Full Circle Food Pantry is a student-led emergency food assistance program serving anyone with a U of A or UAMS student, faculty, or staff ID as well as their household. The food pantry provides a three-day supply of both non-perishables, fresh local produce, and personal care items up to two times per week.

Did You Know...?

Did you know that there's a garden and courtyard located on the roof of <u>Vol Walker Hall</u>? The view of South Fayetteville is especially beautiful in the fall.

First Day Checklist

Before your first day, your supervisor will complete several forms to assist you in adjusting to working on campus.	
	Activate your UARK email – Visit password.uark.edu and click "Activate New Account".
	Campus ID card – Your supervisor will complete your <u>ID card authorization form</u> . When they've completed the form, head to the <u>Razorback Card Office</u> located at the Student Union (435 Garland Avenue #380) to get your ID card.
	Key card – Your supervisor will complete your key card. Take the completed key card to the key office at 521 S. Razorback Road. The entrance is marked and located on Mitchell Street across from the intramural fields. You will need to bring your campus ID. Be sure not to sign the card until instructed to do so by the key office personnel.
	Parking permit – Parking permits can be <u>purchased online</u> using the Manage Parking Account portal. There are two permit options for staff: a yellow permit is designated as general parking for faculty/staff and is somewhat limited. Blue permits are reserved by specific lots but are more expensive.
	Office phone number – Your supervisor will request an office phone number for you.
	Official university portrait – <u>Schedule an appointment</u> to take your portrait. Portraits are taken at Davis Hall (1030 W Maple Street).
	Office and education information – Update your office location and education information in <u>Workday</u> .
